

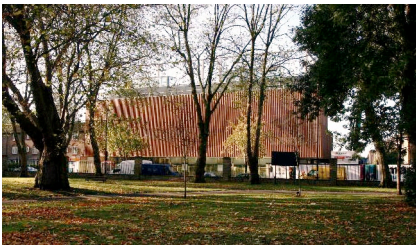

Exemplar Schools Project 2002

One of 11 school designs sponsored by the DfES to develop a shared vision of the schools for the future, creating benchmarks for well designed schools and pushing forward the boundaries of innovation and inspiration. The understanding gained from this process informed the structural thinking and approach on the subsequent City Academies

City Academy, Bristol, £22.4m 2002 - 2004

City Academy for 1250 pupils with specialism in Sports and Arts including a sixth form and provision for 36 SEN students. In addition a new 40x60 metre sports hall and MUGA have been provided.

Northampton Academy, £19.5m 2003 - 2005

City Academy for 1420 pupils with a specialism in Sport with Business & Enterprise. The unusual plan form of the building reacts to the sloping green field site and adopts the landscape as part of the facilities. A flexible structural form was used to allow a high degree of freedom in the placing of the structural columns.

St Mary Magdelene Academy, Islington, 30m 2003 - 2008

Including the provision of a sixth form, primary and nursery schools, this new City Academy through school in North London. The building was developed in two phases allowing the retention of an existing primary school on the site until the completion of the first phase when the school can be decanted.

Paddington Academy, £23.5m 2003 - 2006

The Academy specialities in Media and Performing Arts, Business Enterprise and Sports provides facilities for 1175 students. it was completed in October 2006. The school was constructed in phases on a compact urban site.

Samworth Academy, £23.5m 2004 - 2007

This 1,046 place through-school redefines the traditional primary and secondary organisational model by proposing three phases to bridge the primary and secondary divide.

Michael Faraday Primary School, Southwark 2004

Feasibility design carried out with the Borough Architects for the expansion of this school. Options considered included a complete new build and re-use of the existing school buildings.
